### Creating an Identity Box

Step 1: Students should find a box or container that they feel is large enough to hold 10 items that represent themselves. A shoebox is generally a perfect size and the lid is easily removed to view the objects.

Step 2: Students decorate inside and outside the box with pictures/words/colours that helps describe their character (including the lid)

ie: suitcase with travel stickers favorite art pieces family photos favorite quotes magazine ads

Step 3: Students find 10 or more objects/artifacts that they feel describe their personal and cultural identity and place inside the box.

Step 4: Random share (see: Identity Boxes – Student Activity and Poetry) – assign a number to the box and have students pick a number out of a bag. The only rule is they can not have their own box.
